

Quick Reference Guide: How to opt-out of an Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan

Australian Apprentices receiving an Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan (AASL) can use this guide to help stop their payments. Australian Apprentices automatically receive payments upon successful completion of their Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan application.

1. Navigate to <u>ADMS</u> and login using the Apprentice login button.

NOTE: If you are logging into ADMS for the first time, you will need to set up your ADMS access. Visit the <u>Claiming Apprentice</u> <u>Incentives page</u> on the Australian Apprenticeships website for further information.

 Click 'View my Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan schedule' in the Actions section.



RESULT: The Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan Payment Schedule is displayed.

3. Click 'Opt-out' in the 'Current payment schedule' section.

- 5. Pick a date for opt-out.

RESULT: The cancelled payments will display in the 'Cancelled payments' section.

NOTE: All scheduled payments after the optout date will be cancelled.
